WHAT IS CFS?

CFS is a new service designed for adults with developmental disabilities who choose to live with their families. CFS was created in response to input from families about the lack of available services for adult consumers who choose to live in the family home.



HOW IT WORKS

CFS services will be tailored, individualized, and flexible to meet the changing needs and preferences of the individual being served along with their family. CFS providers help the client organize services, access resources they qualify for, coordinate training for service providers, identify transportation and identify back-up providers.
